

Early Warning System Analysis – Spring 2005

Of the 90 credit classes offered at the Vail/Eagle Valley Campus in the Spring 2005 semester, Early Warning grades were completed for 81 (90%) classes which represents 858 students (some duplicated) of which 720 selected the “letter grade” option. At the mid-point of the semester, the week of 2/28, 81 (~11%) students were identified as earning a C - (72.4%) or lower grade.

Of the 80 identified students, 8 (~10%) were administratively withdrawn and 12 (~15%) withdrew. Of the 60 remaining students, 29 (46%) passed the class with a C - or better. 20 (~33%) of the students failed the class. 9 (~11%) earned D grades and 2 (3%) did not complete the course work.

Other interesting trends appear in the data which include the number of students who were not identified in the Early Warning process and whose grade was lower by the end of the semester and those who also raised their grade by the end of the semester.
