My student file has been misplaced several times and I have had to supply the file with copies of important documents that thank God I had. It just seems to me that there is much disorganization and miscommunication on several levels at the college. At least here at the Summit Campus that is. I now work with a

counselor who has been there for about 2-3 years I think, but we did just lose the Division Director of Business and the Dean of the Summit Campus. I just feel that this campus lacks some professionalism and that is definitely unfortunate. I would recommend Colorado Mountain College to others, but I would significantly caution them to constantly be on their guard.
