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FEATURED COURSES

EMS-130 INTRAVENOUS THERAPY

PREREQUISITES: EMS 145, EMS 146, AND EMS 170 WITH A GRADE OF B OR HIGHER.

Focuses on cognitive and skill practice as required by Colorado Prehospital Care Program for EMT Basic Level IV approval. Examines criteria, procedures and techniques for IV therapy, discusses fluid and electrolyte balance, medication administration, and principles and treatment for shock.



HPR-190 BASIC EKG INTERPRETATION

LEC 30 CONTACT HOURS

Provides instruction for interpretation of EKG strips, anatomy and physiology of the heart, using three-lead monitoring as a guide. Twelve-lead EKG may be discussed.

ESL-901 ESL WORKPLACE WRITING & COMPUTING SKILLS

This ESL class is designed to give students the English and applied digital skills they need to be successful in today's workplace

GED-933 GED PREPARATION

CMC Leadville's High School Equivalency program uses a flexible model that offers morning classes, evening classes, individualized instruction, and online support.

PSY-102 GENERAL PSYCHOLOGY II

Focuses on the scientific study of behavior including cognition, language, intelligence, psychological assessment, personality, abnormal psychology, therapy, life span development, and social psychology.

ENG-221 CREATIVE WRITING I

PREREQUISITES: ENG 121 WITH A GRADE OF C- OR HIGHER.

Examines techniques for creative writing by exploring imaginative uses of language through creative genres (fiction, poetry, and other types of creative production such as drama, screenplays, graphic narrative, or creative nonfiction) with emphasis on the student's own unique style, subject matter, and needs.

ENG-222 CREATIVE WRITING II

PREREQUISITES: PRIOR COMPLETION OF ENG 221 WITH A GRADE OF C- OR HIGHER.

Provides continued development of written expression in the creative genres (fiction, poetry, and other types of creative production such as drama, screenplays, graphic narrative, or creative nonfiction) with emphasis on the student's own unique style, subject matter and needs.



HWE-100 HUMAN NUTRITION

LEC 45 CONTACT HOURS

Introduces basic principles of nutrition with emphasis on personal nutrition. Satisfies nutrition requirement of students entering health care professions.

PED-150 FITNESS WALKING

LAB 30 CLOCK HOURS

This class is designed to improve cardiovascular fitness and strengthen all major muscle groups. This low impact, aerobic walking will also build endurance.
