The Board’s policy is that there shall be unrestricted admissions without discrimination, in accord with the College’s mission, except those listed below concerning proof of immunization. In doing so, the College will ensure non-discrimination based on disability, race, creed, color, sex, age, national origin, ancestry, sexual orientation, religion, or any other protected class. Admission to the College shall not assure acceptance of an individual student in a particular program or course. College administration may deny the admission, continued enrollment, or re-enrollment in cases where there is any question of general student welfare, campus safety, fraudulent credentials, or any other form of fraud or criminal activity.

**1. Proof of Immunization**

Traditional-aged students seeking admission to residential campuses must show proof of immunization pursuant to C.R.S. title 25, article 4, part 9 prior to attending on-campus classes. Non-traditional adult students are defined as those who are part-time and/or non-degree seeking.

**2. Minimum Age**

It is the policy of the Board to admit students who are seventeen (17) years of age or older and are not enrolled in a regular course of study (public or private) at the kindergarten through twelfth grade level. The College President or designee may grant a waiver of the minimum age based on students meeting the criteria outlined in the underage admission procedure. Pursuant to statute, ninth through twelfth grade students may register for courses offered by the College through Concurrent Enrollment (CE) programs.

The College President or designee shall promulgate such procedures as may be necessary for the implementation of this policy.
