The Board shall annually review and approve tuition rates as required by applicable state law. Increases or decreases to tuition rates at Colorado Mountain College (CMC) may be approved only by the Board. Only the Board can establish college-wide discounts, waivers, and modifications to established tuition rates.

TUITION CLASSIFICATION

Tuition classifications at Colorado Mountain College are as follows:

IN-STATE CLASSIFICATION

The determination of Colorado residency for tuition purposes is set forth in Colorado law (Title 23, Article 7, Colorado Revised Statutes) and Colorado Commission on Higher Education (CHE) Policy Section VI, Part B. To be classified a Colorado resident, a student must be domiciled in the state for twelve (12) months prior to registration and meet the classification criteria found in Title 23, Article 7 Colorado Revised Statutes and CHE Policy Section VI, Part B.

IN-DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION

To gain in-district status, a student must be a Colorado state resident for tuition purposes as found in Title 23, Article 7 Colorado Revised Statutes and Colorado Commission On Higher Education Policy Section VI, Part B and domiciled in the six- (6)-county Colorado Mountain College District for a minimum of thirty-two (32) days prior to registration.

SERVICE AREA CLASSIFICATION

To gain in-service area status, a student must be a Colorado state resident for tuition purposes as found in Title 23, Article 7, Colorado Revised Statutes and Colorado Commission on Higher Education Policy Section VI, Part B and domiciled in Chaffee, Grand, or Jackson county for a minimum of thirty-two (32) days prior to registration.

NON-RESIDENT CLASSIFICATION

Non-resident tuition rates shall be charged to students who cannot meet the qualifying criteria for the in-state, in-district, or service area classifications described in this policy.

The College shall publish procedures for determining tuition classification, charging tuition, and providing refunds to students in the official college catalog.

TUITION DISCOUNTS, WAIVERS, AND MODIFICATIONS

The Colorado Mountain College Board of Trustees may adopt tuition discounts, waivers, and modified rates for certain groups of students. Such discounts, waivers, and rate modifications will remain in force for the academic year for which they were adopted. The Board of Trustees must adopt tuition discounts, waivers, and modifications on an annual basis. Board action on tuition discount, waivers, and modified rates must take place at the same time as or before final action on the College’s operating budget for the next fiscal year.
